Cheryl Leone Krueger, age 60, of Dassel, died, Saturday, November 11, 2017, at her home. A memorial service will be held on Thursday at 1:30 p.m. at the Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Dassel with the Rev. Laurie O'Shea officiating. The interment of the urn will take place on a later date at the Lake Arvilla Cemetery in rural Dassel.

There will be a time to gather with the family from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday evening at the Johnson Funeral Home in Dassel and an hour prior to the service on Thursday at the Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Dassel.

For the past seven years the family has spent time at the Rainbow Resort in Waubun, Minnesota. She was a wonderful wife, mother, grandmother and sister who took great care of her family and was always willing to lend a hand wherever she was needed. She enjoyed going to her grandchildren's events, be it a dance recital or a hockey

game, she enjoyed them all. She will be missed by her family and her friends.
