Gary Jay Krick, age 57, of Dassel, died Monday, April 20, 2020, at the Hutchinson Hospital. A private interment will be held at the St. Patrick's Catholic Cemetery in Sauk Rapids on a later date.

Gary Jay Krick, the son of Donald and Margie (Weiman) Krick, was born on September 13, 1962, in Saint Cloud, Minnesota. 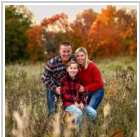
